## Annual Report of the College Development Committee (CDC)

### Academic Year 2019-20

The College Development Committee started functioning from the beginning of the academic year 2018-19 and it is the main body to recommend the comprehensive development plan to the college management. The College Development Committee in general includes overall teaching programmes, academic calendar, annual financial estimates, staff and student welfare activities, admissions, audits and infrastructure development, IQAC meeting proceedings etc.

In the academic year 2019-20 four College Development Committee meeting were held on 15<sup>th</sup> June, 2019, 18<sup>th</sup> November, 2019, 22<sup>nd</sup> February, 2020 and 30<sup>th</sup> April, 2020. In all the meetings there was almost full quorum.

The academic calendar and the budget were discussed and approved.

The perspective plan discussed in June 2018 in the CDC meeting was again reviewed. Hon. Secretary Capt. Vinod Sharma said that the building construction could not happen because some permissions from the government could not be procured but all the same continuous follow up was being done. Regarding the new academic programs, it was decided that the college should wait for autonomy.

The carrier advancement scheme for eligible teachers was discussed and it was decided that they should be asked to keep all their documents ready. It was discussed that the seven teachers participating in the conference in July 2019 should implement their learning in the Indian Education System. It was decided that projectors and other ICT equipments should be upgraded or purchased. It was decided that as the discussion with the stakeholders was completed and the paperwork was also almost completed, the college should apply for autonomy as soon as possible. It was also decided that the forums of departments be formed to increase the scope of activities.

The next meeting was held on 18<sup>th</sup> November, 2019. The agenda of this meeting included uploading of AQAR, NSS camp, and submission of application for autonomy.

: The AQAR was ready and placed in the meeting by IQAC convenor. It was that it should be uploaded on the website. It was decided that all support be given to the teachers who applied for minor research projects in the University of Mumbai. It was decided that seven day rural camp be organized at Mamnoli village in January 2020. It was decided that all the staff should be directed to start working on the presentations and organize all the data systematically for inspection by the UGC Expert Committee as the application for autonomy was already submitted. It was also decided to take guidance from experts. The meeting ended with vote of thanks.

The next meeting was held on 22<sup>nd</sup> February, 2020. The agenda of the meeting was to discuss UGC Expert Committee Visit, Examination Schedules and to discuss implications of impending pandemic.


It was decided that all the presentations and documentary support system should be examined by the Principal and the Vice Principal. The Principal informed that all preparations are almost over. Various ad-hoc committees were to be formed for the UGC Expert Committee Visit. The examination schedules were discussed and approved. It was discussed that the world was moving towards a pandemic situation and that same situation could hit India as well. Dr. Bhamare suggested that there should be extra caution in every thing and the college should be ready to face an unknown emergency situation. The meeting ended with vote of thanks.

The next meeting was held on 30<sup>th</sup> April, 2020 and the agenda was to acquire software for online academic/ co-curricular activities and organizing webinars etc.

This meeting was organized online and it was decided that the best software should be procured by the college for online education. Already the college acquired the paid version ZOOM software for the ongoing Ph. D. coursework. Tasting the success it was decided that more webinar should be planned. It was also decided that the teachers should be trained for online teaching because already there were talks circulating that the pandemic could exist for a long period. Te meeting ended with vote of thanks.

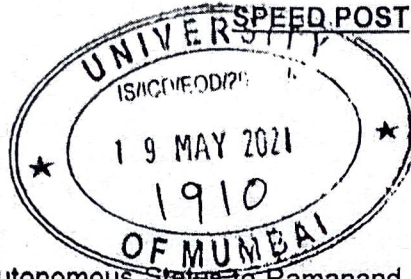


This is with reference to the proposal submitted by Ramanand Arya D.A.V. College, Veer Savarkar Marg, Bhandup East, Mumbai, Maharashtra-400 042 affiliated to University of Mumbai, under the UGC Scheme for Autonomous Colleges.

As per the decision of the Standing Committee constituted by University Grants Commission, in its meeting held on 12.04.2021, the Competent Authority has decided to grant autonomous status to **Ramanand Arya D.A.V. College, Veer Savarkar Marg, Bhandup East, Mumbai, Maharashtra-400 042** affiliated to **University of Mumbai**, for a period of Ten (10) years from the session 2021-2022 to 2030-2031 as per provisions of Clause 3.13 and Clause 6.4 (i) of UGC Regulations dated 12.02.2018.

The University is requested to issue necessary notification/order regarding the grant of autonomous status to the college as per UGC (Conferment of Autonomous Status Upon Colleges and Measures for Maintenance of Standards in Autonomous Colleges) Regulations, 2018 for Autonomous Colleges. The college, if eligible, shall apply for autonomy grant as per the norms laid down in the Regulations.

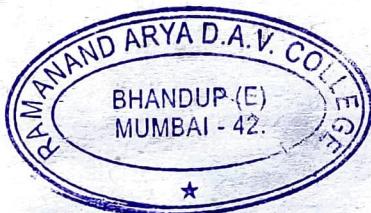

The college shall also apply in the prescribed format to University Grants Commission for extension of autonomous status six months prior to the expiry of the autonomous cycle.
